Access to Care

- To improve access to health care and preventive resources for people with low incomes and those uninsured by deploying programs to assist with navigating the health care system.
- To increase the number of people in the community who report being able to access primary health care services and the number of people who report receiving culturally responsive care.
- Primary care and mental health provider to population ratios have improved which has resulted in patients being connected with community services and resources in a timely manner.
- To ease the way for people to access the appropriate level of care at the right time.
- To increase the percentage of people with insurance in the community.

- A sufficient supply of safe, affordable housing units to ensure that all people in the community have access to a healthy place to live that meets their needs.
- A reduction in housing cost burden in the community based on increased affordable housing options and increased economic opportunities.
