



About Swedish

Swedish was founded in 1910 by Dr. Nils Johanson, a surgeon, and a group of Seattle's Swedish-born businessmen. The 24-bed converted apartment has evolved into the First Hill campus, a 697-bed, nonprofit medical center. In 1932, Swedish opened the first cancer-care center west of the Mississippi. Today, it treats more people for more types of cancer than any other provider in the Pacific Northwest.

Including First Hill, Swedish has grown to five separate campuses: Ballard, Cherry Hill, Edmonds, and Issaquah. Swedish also has over 70 medical clinics in Bellevue, Mill Creek, Redmond and Seattle.

A Commitment to Excellence

In addition to general medical and surgical care, Swedish is known as a regional referral center providing treatment in the areas of oncology, cardiac care, high-risk obstetrics, neurosciences, orthopedic surgery and organ transplantation. Swedish also boasts a number of specialty programs, including sleep disorders, pain-management, and home health and hospice services.

Over the past 100 years Swedish has grown into the Northwest's largest, most comprehensive health-care facility. Swedish now boasts more than 6,800 employees and a medical staff of almost 2,300 providers. As Swedish has evolved, its founder's vision remains unchanged: to be the best nonprofit medical facility in the region.
